INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM (IB)

Harbor High School is an IB World School. Our IB courses are open to all students. Through these courses, our students learn to be internationally minded leaders who are ready to solve problems creatively and to build a more peaceful world. The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme courses are offered in the eleventh and twelfth grades. Courses can be one or two years in length, taken at the standard or higher level. The IB Diploma Programme curriculum is based on inquiry, focused on conceptual understanding, and developed in local and global contexts. This approach allows students to develop intercultural understanding and navigate their complex, 21st Century world with knowledge, compassion and integrity.

Five units of credit are awarded for each semester passed with a grade of D or better. Passing grades are A, B, C, D, P, CR.

A standard four-point scale is used to calculate grade point average (GPA):

A = 4
B = 3
C = 2
D = 1
F = 0

IB, AP, and Honors courses are weighted and given an additional point for GPA (A=5, B=4, etc).
